Transport Volunteer Code of Conduct

Saco River Wildlife Center (SRWC) is a 501(c)(3) non-profit organization in Limington, Maine founded in 2015 by Bethany Brown. Bethany holds a state-license for wildlife rehabilitation to treat orphaned, injured, and ill wildlife. SRWC admits most native mammal species including ground squirrels, tree squirrels, porcupines, opossums, raccoons, skunks, weasels, and foxes. Our mission is to provide best practice treatment to all patients in our care with the ultimate goal of release.

As a transport volunteer you are a representative of Saco River Wildlife Center and the State of Maine. You are likely to enter the finder's property and/or home. Please demonstrate the highest standard of conduct. Be respectful of their property and/or home and treat finders with respect and kindness. For your safety and the safety of the animal, please follow these rules while transporting wildlife to SRWC. Wild animals can die from stress! To make transport as stress-free as possible, please do the following:

- NEVER touch the wildlife
- Keep cage/carrier completely covered with a sheet, towel, or blanket
- If you must talk, please use a whisper
- Keep car radio off
- No other animals or children in the car
- No smoking
- No food or water for the animal
